What is Take Part?

Take Part is a distinctive approach to learning that enables people to make an active contribution to their communities and influence public policies and services.

The Take Part approach

Take Part is a distinctive approach to learning that enables people to make an active contribution to their communities and influence public policies and services by focusing on:

- community-based learning to build the skills, confidence and experience needed to tackle local political, social and technical challenges
- an informal, practical approach that gives people an understanding of how power works and how they can learn to influence decisions and policies
- open dialogue and reflection as key learning tools, recognising that change in a community emerges from individuals working together

Policy makers and institutions who seek to involve citizens in decision making and in the delivery of public services need to recognise that many citizens do not currently have the knowledge, confidence and skills needed to take advantage of these opportunities and overcome the barriers. In order to develop these skills a sustained approach, informed by the principles of community development, is needed.

The Take Part approach is a tried and tested method which galvanises people to take advantages of opportunities to influence the decisions which affect their localities and the services which they receive. Through increasing the skills and confidence among citizens, particularly those from more disadvantaged communities, Take Part aims to increase levels of participation in civil and civic activity; and to encourage the take up of community leadership roles.
